## 1)Role play

## 2)Narration

The perspective from which a speaker or writer recounts a narrative is called a point of view Types of point of view include first person narrative, which uses "I" and follows the thoughts of one person and third person narrative which can be limited to one person or can show the thoughts of all the characters, called the omniscient third person.
